

Lawyer, wife found beaten to death

VENTURA (AP) — Police are investigating the murder of attorney Lyman R. Smith, 43, said to have been under consideration for a judgeship, and his wife Charlene, 43, who were apparently beaten to death in their bedroom.

The bodies were found about 2.13 p.m. yesterday by Smith's

12-year-old son, Gary, according to police Lt. Randy Adams.

The boy lives with his mother, Smith's ex-wife, and had come over for a Sunday visit, Adams said.

"A preliminary investigation indicates the Smiths received bludgeoning injuries about the head with club-type weapons," Adams said. "An autopsy is

scheduled to determine the exact cause of death."

Police have established no motive and Adams said he preferred not to comment on whether the house showed signs of forcible entry or burglary.
